FRESHEN UP YOUR SPACE

Spring is in the air! As a time of new beginnings, this season provides the perfect opportunity to clean out the old and bring in the new with these helpful spring-cleaning tips:

- **Focus on One Room at a Time.** Cleaning can easily become overwhelming. Avoid the stress by working on one room (e.g., the kitchen) or task (e.g., refrigerator clean out) then moving onto the next.

- Limit card use to specific merchants or purchases
- Control spending by setting limits to match your budget
- Receive real-time notifications when the card is used
