A LEGACY OF SERVICE

It is with heartfelt appreciation the HRCU Board of Directors announces the recent retirement of one of its long serving members, Richard "Dick" J. Ketz. Dick made the decision to step down after serving HRCU for more than 40 years.

"The HRCU Board of Directors, management, and entire credit union team wish to thank Dick for his many decades of service, dedication, and leadership. We are all grateful for his volunteer service and admire his ability to be such an effective contributor for so many years. We wish him the best during his well-deserved retirement." – John H. During Dick's time on the board, HRCU grew from a single field of membership with less than 2,000 members and \$15 million in assets to a county-wide organization serving more than 18,000 members and over \$200 million in assets today.

In honor of Dick's volunteer service, as published in the Spring edition of the newsletter, the Board of Directors has authorized the Richard J. Ketz Honorary Scholarship for Athletic and Academic Achievement. Two annual \$1,000 scholarship awards will be provided to deserving high school seniors who are credit union members.

HRCU's 68th Annual Meeting & Board Election

In accordance with the Credit Union's bylaws, the President of the Board shall appoint a nominating committee at least 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting. It shall be the duty of the nominating Committee at the Annual Meeting to nominate one or more members

for each vacancy for which elections are being held. After the nominations of the committee have been placed before the members, the presiding officer shall call for nominations from the floor.

The election shall be conducted by ballot, except where there is only one nominee for the office. All elections shall be by plurality vote. The nominating committee was appointed at the December 2020 Board Meeting. In 2021, Robert Stablum and Gerald Weiss are current members of the Board of Directors running for re-election.

Our annual meeting is a credit union tradition – one you likely won't experience at a stock-held financial institution. We look forward to seeing you there!



Vacation Clubs.

We understand vacations are often planned at random times throughout the year. To make saving for vacation easier, the annual maturity date of July 1 was removed. Account holders may now make one free withdrawal/transfer per month.²



Tax Clubs

Since many of our members use this club account for reasons other than tax purposes, we changed the name. Now My Club is your club – you decide why you want to save! My Club will still allow one free withdrawal/transfer per month.²
